

# PPE Protocol for bedroom isolation

## When a supported person has symptoms and/or has tested positive for COVID-19:

## Staff will follow these below steps:

- The symptomatic person must self-isolate immediately. If they test positive for COVID-19 the person must remain in bedroom isolation for 5 days. After the 5 days (with improved symptoms), they can return to normal routines, this includes non-restricted access to the community. If symptoms continue beyond the 5 days they will need to remain in bedroom isolation until symptoms have improved for 24 hours.
- ➤ All staff will wear a N95 respirator, gown and face shield when entering the bedroom of the person isolating. This PPE must be donned prior to entering the room.
- All staff will don gloves when providing personal care, cleaning, or doing laundry ensuring that proper <u>hand</u> <u>hygiene</u> is complete prior to donning gloves and again after doffing gloves as well as regularly throughout their shift

When staff are entering the bedroom they will need to:

#### **Donning PPE:**

- Perform hand hygiene
- Don on a gown
- Don a N95 respirator.
- Don a face shield
- Don gloves. Ensure that the gown is tucked into the wrist of the glove.

## **Doffing PPE:**

- Doff gloves and dispose in garbage located directly outside of the washroom/ bedroom, using the foot pedal to open and close the lid.
- Perform proper hand hygiene
- Doff face shield and place in the tote provided
- Doff disposable gown and dispose in garbage located directly outside of the washroom, using the foot pedal to open and close the lid.
- Perform proper hand hygiene
- Doff N95 respirator and dispose in garbage located directly outside of the washroom area, using the foot pedal to open and close the lid.
- Perform proper hand hygiene
- Disinfect the eye protection and tote with bleach and water mixture, dry and don eye protection
- Perform hand hygiene

#### Disinfecting:

• Use a disinfectant cleaner or Bleach/Water mixture. When using a disinfectant follow the manufacturer instructions and reference the SDS sheet.

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- The bedroom of the supported person who is in isolation will be disinfected four times daily. This will be
  performed during times of support as you are minimizing the amount of entry times and usage of PPE.
  Disinfecting will include: all commonly touched surfaces (bed side tables, bed frames, other bedroom furniture,
  light switches, door knobs)
- Staff will disinfect all shared washrooms after every use. All other washrooms will be disinfected two (2) times daily as per the enhanced cleaning checklist. The person who is self-isolating will be provided with his or her own roll of toilet paper to use when in the washroom.

### Laundry for symptomatic and/or positive supported person:

Using proper PPE (gown, N95 respirator, eye protection, gloves as outlined above) gather up the supported person's laundry and place into a bag for easy transfer to the laundry room. Clean clothes, bed linens, bath and hand towels using laundry soap and hot water, and dry thoroughly.

#### Dishes for symptomatic and/or positive supported person:

Disposable cutlery and dishes should be used for any symptomatic supported person. If they are not readily available use gloves, place the dishes in the dishwasher. Immediately remove gloves once dishes are put in the machine and wash your hands. Don clean gloves and disinfect all surfaces that may have been touched including doorknobs, the counter and the front of the dishwasher.

#### If a staff member believe they have COVID-19 they will:

- Contact the COVID 19 Command Post email, your manager and the HR Department Immediately
